US House of Representatives

For the last 10 years, all of Ulster County has been part of Congressional District (CD) 19. The new maps divide Ulster into two districts:

New CD18

City of Kingston, Towns of Esopus, Gardiner, Lloyd, Marletown, Marlborough, New Paltz, Plattekill, Rochester, Rosendale, Shawangunk, and part of Wawarsing

New CD19

Towns of Denning, Hardenburgh, Hurley, Town of Kingston, Olive, Saugerties, Shandaken, Ulster, Woodstock, and part of Wawarsing

New York State Senate

For the last 10 years, Ulster County was represented by four different State Senate Districts (SD). The new maps divide Ulster into two districts:

New SD41

New SD51

Towns of Denning, Gardiner, Hardenburgh, Marletown, Olive, Rochester, Shawangunk, and Wawarsing
